A DAY IN THE LIFE OF REV EVERISTO MUSEDZA

"Together we can"

We sometimes fail to appreciate the breadth and depth of a Minister's work—the significant transformations, the invisible healing, the holding us and keeping us on our spiritual journeys as we navigate life and everything in between. And it's definitely not reflected in the money. However, the value of the effort is evaluated in altered lives and awakened souls rather than in monetary terms.

It doesn't fit neatly into job descriptions or can be organised into tidy boxes. However, the work is as real as light and shadow and as genuine as our every breath.

I asked Rev. Everisto Musedza this week for some motivation and his perspective on a *normal* week.

"I never quite know what to expect every week let alone every day, but I guess that's the privilege of being a parish minister. It is such a privilege and an honour to journey alongside the parishioners. Ideally this is how my normal week is like.

Morning worship: I lead the Sunday service, and I love to welcome everyone, so I stand at the door and do just that and I also see everyone out.

I then go for the tea and coffee and spend a bit of time chatting and answering any questions. During the week I get to do a bit of the administrative duties, emails, correspondence, and planning for upcoming events.

I do meetings, I meet weekly with our session clerk and administrator.
I run two bible study groups on a Tuesday afternoon and a Friday afternoon. The Tuesday one is for adults and the Friday one is for teenagers.

I am passionate about visitations, so I try and do that also during the week. I do set time aside for my personal reflection and study, and I must say I do enjoy my bowling, so Tuesday night is bowling time."

Kirk Café

The Kirk Café continues to provide a warm and welcoming space for the local community on Wednesday mornings. We have established a core group with babies and toddlers who attend regularly, while also welcoming new visitors each week.

The young children enjoy healthy snacks, and our dedicated volunteers, Morian and Maureen, do a wonderful job ensuring that everyone feels at home by offering hot drinks and home baking. Fiona has been sharing her crafting skills with some of the Mums, helping them develop new abilities and grow in confidence. Additionally, each week we take time to read, sing, and engage with stories and songs that reinforce how precious and loved each child is in the eyes of God.

Pizza Church

Pizza Church continues to grow, with a regular group attending each month alongside new families who join us for the first time. Thankfully, attendance has remained manageable within the capacity of our Hall!

Each gathering is an opportunity for fellowship, learning, and worship, creating an atmosphere that is both engaging and welcoming for all. We explore a different theme each month through a family-friendly message, music, craft, and prayer.

In February, we reflected on the theme of Gratitude, focusing on Psalm 100. It has been particularly encouraging to see new volunteers stepping forward to support—some from within our congregation and others who are new to church life but eager to serve and be part of the community and family that Pizza Church is fostering.

Summer Club

Planning is well underway for this year's Summer Club. We have begun discussions with Scripture Union and other local churches in Dunoon to explore opportunities for collaboration.

The Summer Club will take place from 4th to 8th August, aligning with the final full week of the school holidays. We believe this timing will allow us to be a significant blessing to families in our community. The chosen theme, "A Tale of Two Kings," is a Scripture Union programme that will explore the lives of King David and King Jesus, helping children engage with biblical stories in a meaningful way.

Holy Week: Digital Ministry Resources

EASTER

Part of the digital ministry strategy is to create resources and host sessions to enable us to create locally produced resources and teams. We have produced digital ministry resources for Holy Week based on the lectionary readings for use in services, sharing on websites and social media.

A theme appeared through the readings of the servant heart of Jesus which underpins the content as we seek to explore the mercy found at the throne from Hebrews 4:14-16, a reading for Good Friday.

Each day has a different item of content with multiple contributors from across the Church. Horizontal videos are typically best for Facebook, Youtube and websites. Vertical reels are usually best for Instagram and TikTok. The blog has images and can be shared on multiple platforms or might be helpful for a service.

The Tennebrae service for Good Friday has no licence requirements as it is a bespoke creation by Phill Melstrom, national worship development worker.

Overview:

- *Palm Sunday*; 'Holy Week @thestart' (intro to what Holy Week is) by Rev Ruth Kennedy, Digital Ministries Advisor. Vertical and Horizontal videos.
- *Monday*; 'the value of Mary' artistic reflection by Linda Hoskins, Christian artist in Edinburgh (LindaHoskinsArt). Vertical video only.
- *Tuesday*; 'Inside not outside?' Thoughts by Rev Trish Archibald, Assistant Minister, Stirling North Parish Church. Vertical and Horizontal videos.
- Wednesday; 'Mercy that serves to the end' Blog (possible sermon points) by Neill Shaw, Priority Areas Development Worker. Word and pdf.
- *Thursday*; 'Jesus held my feet' testimony by Steven McLeish, Scotland Country Head, The Leprosy Mission.
- Good Friday; 'Tennebrae Service' explanation and 13min service by Phill Melstrom, Worship Development Worker. Horizontal video with readings and lyrics included.
- *Holy Saturday*; 'Hope for Holy Saturday' reflective poem by Christine Colliar, Reader and Candidate for OLM, Scots Kirk Lausanne. Vertical and Horizontal videos.
- Easter Sunday; 'Easter Message from the Moderator' will be shared on the national platforms.


