MESSAGE FROM THE CLERK

“Agus a' dol a-steach dhan taigh, chunnaic iad am pàiste còmhla ri Moire a mhàthair, agus thuit iad sìos is rinn iad adhradh dha. An uair sin, a' fosgladh nan ionmhasan aca, thairg iad tiodhlacan dha: òr is tùis is mirr.” Mata 2.11

Gu dearbh tha Ìosa airidh air na h-uile, a chionn 's gun do bhunaich e ar slàinte: prìseil air a shon ach saor air asgaidh air ar son-ne. Nach e toirt nan tiodhlac a th' anns an dòigh far a chuireas sinn ar luachachadh? Dè, mar sin, an tiodhlac a bheir sinn dha am bliadhna?

In this season of Epiphany, as we reflect on the gifts which the Magi brought to Jesus and presented with such reverence, how are we inspired to express our own devotion?

Through faith in Jesus, our sins are forgiven and we can look forward to reigning with him eternally in the new creation. That amounts to a bomb-proof inheritance to carry us through the tribulations of this life, whatever the world throws at us. How shall we live then?

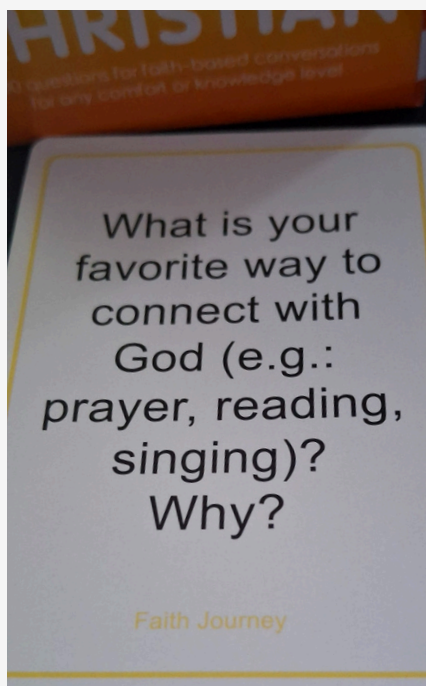
