MESSAGE FROM OUR CLERK

A bharrachd air sin, nach nochd e ùghdarras Ìosa air a' chruthachadh agus toileachas Ìosa ar fiachan a phàigheadh? Abair Slànaighear fialaidh mar sin!

We talk about pulling rabbits out of a hat. The Bible is replete with stories of how God produces answers to situations that defy expectations. Indeed the narrative stream of scripture is about how God redeems the whole of creation despite humankind's hopeless failure as stewards of that creation and despite the malevolent intervention of the Devil. At every level and in every place God is transforming apparently futile situations into transforming experiences of healing, grace and hope.

And he is still at it! Examples continue to abound of the Holy Spirit bringing the love of God into the darkest and most unlikely corners of life and of the world.

Should this not encourage us in our struggle to make sense of a chaotic world, in our bewliderment over the state of our church and the indifference of society to the voice of God? Of course it should.

We are resurrection people, witnesses to the fact that Jesus died our death and then overcame the power of death, so that we who believe and trust and follow him can share in his inheritance of eternal life.

Let that promise fortify us in our personal struggles, when tragedy hits or in ordinary moments of self doubt, and as we wrestle to live faithfully through the restructuring of the Church of Scotland in the Highlands & Hebrides. Last night I attended the ordination of the first OLM in the neighbouring Presbytery of Lewis.

Today I joined the faithful of Upper Cowal for the swansong of our oldest serving Minister of Word & Sacrament. God is good as life goes on...

This is the programme that we conceived during the Covid pandemic and have been steadily implementing since. Now, finally, the moment came when Thokozani Chilembwe and Hastings Phale successfully completed the degree and were ready to graduate. Others hope to follow in their footsteps soon.


